Lakewood Heritage Center is a 20th century museum located in Belmar Park. It is home to over a dozen unique historic structures and houses on 15 acres with more than 30,000 artifacts and photographs. It also houses different pieces of farm equipment and vehicles from the 20th century. The Visitor Center contains two galleries: the Spirit of Lakewood, which tells the story of Lakewood, and the Radius Gallery, which hosts two unique rotating exhibits each year.



Alternative Educational Programs

Are Lakewood Heritage Center's education programs available to other groups such as homeschools, seniors, scouts and members of the public?

- Absolutely! Our programs and pricing can be adjusted to accommodate a variety of groups. For example, Brownies and Juniors can earn badges with programs called Celebrating Community, My Family Story and Playing in the Past. Homeschool groups can take advantage of a Day in the Country School activity that is appropriate for all ages, and senior groups love our decade trunks.



General Tour

(one hour in length, maximum 30 students)

Experience all of the historic buildings at the Lakewood Heritage Center. Go back in time, starting with the diner, beauty salon and variety store. Compare these mid-century buildings with the 1920s school and the 1930s home.
